#### History

#### **Prehistory - Stone Age**

Learn about technology, ritual, and daily life before written history began. Handle tools and investigate how life has changed from 30,000 years ago. W

#### Ancient Egyptians –

#### **Marvellous Mummies**

Discover the process of mummification and

the techniques and beliefs involved, then look closely at Ta-Kesh. mummified over 3000 years ago. WOC



#### **Ancient Greeks**

Handle Ancient Greek artefacts and replicas to find out what they were used for and what they can tell us about life in that time. WOC

#### **Roman Britain – Invaders and Settlers**

Contrast Roman arms and armour with the benefits of the Roman invasion — what did the World War I Romans bring to Britain? . WO

Anglo-Saxons - Finery, Feasting, Fighting! Explore Anglo Saxon every day life using artefacts, gallery work and Beowulf! Use ipads to record findings. (gallery based) W

#### The Tudors

Explore the differences between rich and poor in Tudor society and try a Tudor dance in the 16th century Great Hall. WO

#### The Victorians - Childhood

Find out what it was like to be a Victorian child using artefacts to learn about a child's life, jobs, playtime and school, with opportunities to write with an ink pen, try on costume and play with toys. WOC

#### **Explorers**

Discover the world of local Victorian explorer Julius Brenchley! Investigate objects from around the world using maps, objects and photos. (gallery based) W

#### **Toys Through Time**

Handle old and new toys to find out how they have evolved through new materials and how play has changed. WOC

#### Local History - Industry and ....sweets!

Learn about some of Maidstone's key industries—papermaking, brewing and sweet making. Find out how advertising changed the Sharps company from a small shop to a factory that impacted on Maidstone's growth. W

Use letters, artefacts and a painting to find out how different the war could be for soldiers in the trenches and people at home. W WW1 Discover Arts Award also available.

#### World War II – A Child's Experience

Glimpse how life changed for children affected by the war using objects from the museum's collection. W

#### **Dinosaurs & Fossils**

Learn about how fossils are formed through role play, handle real dinosaur bones, and investigate like a palaeontologist WOC



#### **Animal Encounters**

Become a scientist investigating food chains and habitats linked to the very varied local Kent environments. (gallery based) W

#### **Rocks and Minerals**

Explore what rocks and minerals are, the different types, and how they can be identified. WO

#### Archaeology Detectives—

#### A load of rubbish!

Find out how archaeologists dig for artefacts and what the objects they find can tell us about the way people lived in the past. W

#### Minibeast Mania (summer term only)

Learn about different types of 'mini beast' using real specimens and go on a bug hunt. W

#### **Art Detectives**

Investigate different artworks from our gallery. Look for clues and discover what the artists are trying share. Looks at portraits, scenes and events. Includes creating sketches of your ideas. (gallery based) W

#### **Literacy**

#### Night in the Museum

Use the museum galleries as a backdrop to creating your own role play. Work in small groups to generate ideas, plan and create a story which will be acted out on film in the galleries. General literacy themed (gallery based) W

#### Carriage Museum

Visits are available to the Carriage Museum from Wednesday-Friday between May and July, from 12-4pm. We have a trail and activity sheets for your own self led tour. Charges apply. Please book in usual way.

#### Arts Awards

The Learning Team are able to offer 'Arts Award: Discover' packages - for KS1 and 2. The day is broken into 3-4 exciting sessions that include investigating the galleries, experimenting with art forms in our studio, to be followed with a little school-based research and sharing. Cost includes; follow up in school, log books, moderation and certificates.

Themes available; Orts Dinosaurs, Ancient Greeks, WW1, Japanese Printing. We are also able to offer bespoke themed awards linked to our galleries or other workshops.
