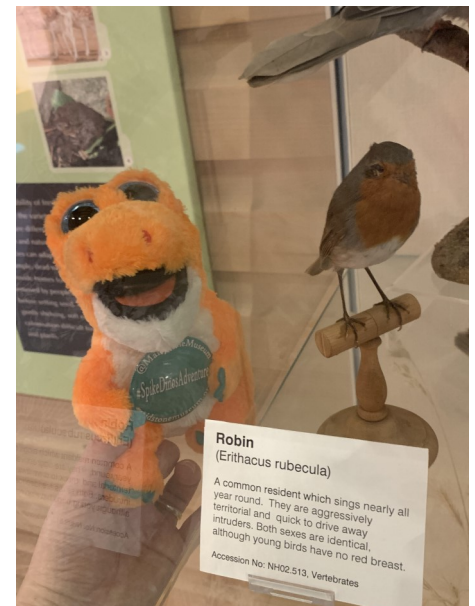
## Robins—Natural History

Robins are songbirds that nest in trees. Seeing them in the garden are a sign that spring is on the way. They search for insects and especially like pulling worms from the ground. Our robin doesn't have as bright a red breast as those in the garden but they are the easiest bird to identify.

A common resident which sings nearly all year round. They are aggressively territorial and quick to drive away intruders. Both sexes are identical, although young birds have no red breast.
