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How to book and information about loans

Educational organisations (with premises) are welcome to book our loans boxes. To book, please email museumeducation@maidstone.gov.uk with the information requested in the Loans request form below.

By making a booking, your organisation is agreeing to the terms and conditions in the loans agreement form in this document. Please do not make a request/booking without first reading this agreement. A request does not guarantee a loan.

A confirmation of your booking will be sent to you. It is advisable to book as far in advance as possible. From time to time, loans boxes may be removed for redevelopment or contents may vary from the list below. Accurate contents will be listed in the box you receive. Boxes contain at approx 10 items, except for the Natural History boxes. Additional loans box themes will be added over time and this document periodically updated. Loan Length

Loans are for 5-6 weeks. Set dates are in place for loans to allow for ease of collection, return checking and reissue. This also allows us to quarantine boxes for 72 hours and fully clean the contents before the next use.

These are as follows for the year 2022-23; (Saturday collect/return dates -10-11am)

- T1; Saturday 3 Sept to Saturday 15 Oct 2022
- T2; Saturday 29 Oct to Saturday 10 Dec 2022
- T3; Saturday 7 Jan to Saturday 11 Feb 2023
- T4; Saturday 18 Feb to Saturday 1 April 2023
- T5; Saturday 15 April to Saturday 27 May 2023
- T6; Saturday 3 June to Saturday 15 July 2023

Collection and Return dates are set to allow us to clean/quarantine and repair (if needed) or replace objects.



Cost and Payment

Loans are charged at £50 per box per 5/6 week period. Schools will be invoiced once the box is returned.

There will be an additional charge for late return of loans boxes of £5 per day.

Collecting from the Museum

Loans items are to be collected from the Museum main reception on *Saturday* between 10 - 11am on the date agreed in your loan booking. Loans must be collected by car and not taken on public transport. You will be asked to sign a copy of the loan agreement on collection and again on return.

If you do not collect your loans items, you will still be charged for your booking.

Loans items should be returned to the Museum main reception on Saturday between 10 - 11am on the date agreed in your loan booking.

If you have any unexpected issues with collecting/returning the loans boxes, please get intouch with the Learning Officer as soon as possible.

Any damage to specimens, replicas and artefacts will be charged to the school concerned, so that we can purchase replacements. **Damage should be reported immediately** and not left to the time return as this can delay the box going out to the next school.

CONDITIONS OF USE - SERVICE AGREEMENT

By making a booking a Loan Box you have agreed to abide by the terms and conditions below

- It is a condition of the loan that objects are used for educational use only and not for profit making purposes.
- Due care and diligence must be taken to safeguard the items on loan.
- Items on loan must be locked away when not in use.
- Borrowers are liable for costs of breakages or loss for up to £150 per box. Damage should be reported immediately.
- Evaluation forms must be completed for each loans box and handed in when returning the loan.
- Loans must be collected and returned on specified days/times
- Late returns will be charged at £5 per day

When using the Loans Service:

DO:-

- Ensure all objects are handled with care, they are a finite collection.
- Please keep them in a secure place, especially overnight.
- Make one member of staff responsible for orders and sharing information contained within this agreement and other relevant information with colleagues
- Order objects early.
- Handle objects over a table, preferably over a soft surface one object, two hands. (see further guidelines in the loans box)
- Read any packaging instructions carefully
- Wash hands before and after use.

DO NOT:-

- Display objects/materials in direct sunlight.
- Bury objects in soil / sand, or submerge in water.
- Affix adhesives, labels, Sellotape, blue-tack etc to loans or loan cases.
- Attempt to repair damaged objects or modify objects in any way.
- Wear items unless marked for such use.

Natural History Loans

Specimens in the natural history collection that are not suitable for handling are displayed in Perspex boxes which give an 'all-round view' when removed from their carrying cases. **Some boxes are quite large, heavy and difficult to carry.**

Please make sure that the Perspex boxes are correctly positioned on the runners within the wooden boxes. If they are transported incorrectly it can damage them.

Collecting from the Museum

- Loans must be collected and returned on specified days/times as agreed when booking.
- Additional fees apply for late returns.
- Collection should be with a car as boxes contain artefacts and some are heavy. They should not be taken on public transport.



The Learning Team will ensure the following standards

- Loans boxes support the National Curriculum.
- Customer satisfaction is gauged through evaluation.
- Email/Telephone response time is within five working days.

Loans during the Covid-19 Pandemic

- When collecting and returning the box you will be asked to sign 2 copies of the loan document.
 It would be helpful if you bring your own pen to do this to reduce contamination between museum staff and yourself.
- Loans boxes should only be used by the booked 'bubble'. If it is being used by multiple 'bubbles' within a school items should be quarantined for at least 72 hours between uses.
- Boxes are quarantined at the museum between loans for 72 hours and are then cleaned with specialist cleaner. We allow at least one week between loans for this purpose. Please don't clean objects yourself.
- Adults and children should wash and dry their hands before and after handling the objects.
- The Learning Team should be contacted immediately should a Covid-19 outbreak occur in the school whilst the box is on site. In this case we would ask that the box is quarantined in school for 72 hours prior to it being returned to the museum. (time for this should be allowed within the loan period)
- This guidance will be updated in line with government guidelines.

Notes:

- By 'bubble' we mean the class groups, year group or department the school has grouped their students into.
- Quarantine is for 72 hours between return and clean.

Object Handling Guidelines — Teachers

Before attempting to pick up an object consider the following......

How delicate is the object?

All museum objects are put at risk when being handled and therefore need to be treated delicately.

Can you tell how delicate the object is by sight?

It is often hard to tell by sight how delicate an object is. Always assume it is more fragile than it appears to be.

Are there any weak points?

Look for signs of cracking, historical repairs, unsafe joints, loose parts or delicate materials. Sometimes the most robust looking objects can disguise weak areas caused by decay or a bad repair that has since degraded.

Where am I going to move the object to...? Is your pathway clear?

If you are involved in moving objects around ALWAYS ensure that you have somewhere to place the object down. A seemingly lightweight object can soon become heavy if you find that your path is blocked or the area where you were going to place your object down is no longer free. Never attempt to lift an

object above chest height, even light objects.

Where should I pick the object up from?

Having considered the above, you should now be ready to pick the object up. Hold the object close to your body at waist height using both hands to support its weight. (If an object is in parts, either transport it in a padded container, or carry each item separately .taking two trips.) If the object has a handle—do not use it!

Never attempt to lift an object that is too heavy for you, always ask for assistance.



Object Handling Guidelines — Pupils

Ensure your hands are clean before handling the objects.

Handle objects whilst sitting at a table or on the floor.

Only handle one object at a time.

Use two hands to hold the object.

Do not hold the object by the handles or parts that stick out, as these can easily break off.

Do not snatch objects from other people while they are handling them.

Do not walk around with objects.


