37. Common Carder Bee

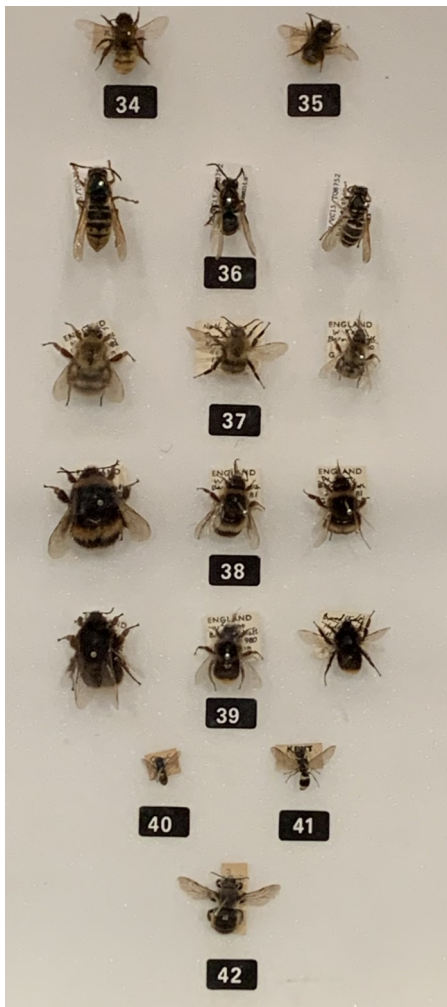
38. Buff Tailed Bumble Bee
