- •The wooly mammoth is an extinct animal that once roamed earth until roughly 1700 BC.
- •It was found roaming the frozen arctic tundra in large herds.
- •It is believed to be closely related to elephants.
- •Adult mammoths reached heights of 4 metres or more.
- •They had enormous tusks that would have been used for digging and collecting food, as well as fighting off predators.
- •Mammoths ate similar vegetation to elephants leaves, fruit, nuts, twigs, and berries.
- •Woolly mammoths are thought to have had long lifespans, getting to an average of 70 years old.


Spike liked the fact that they were related to elephants, but had woolly fur all over them to help them keep warm.








Make your own Mammoth







Step 2. Cut out the 4 legs and stick two on each side of your toilet roll.

Step 3. Cut out the tail and stick to one end of the roll



Step 4. Cut out the head pieces and stick to the other end of the toilet roll.


Step 5. If you have brown tissue, paper, or wool, give your mammoth a woolly coat.












Cut out 4 legs
