## Secret Spaces;

While exploring some of the behind the scenes places around the museum, Spike found this secret balcony. When he looked down he could see the Anglo Saxon collection and the door into the Natural History Gallery. Next time you visit, look up and you'll see the balcony Spike is on. It's only accessible through the back offices.



Do you have somewhere in your house where you can look down and see another room, garden or hallway? When you look down on something - a place or an object - it's called an aerial or bird's eye view. When you draw it it's called a plan.

## Activity;

Today have a go at drawing a bird's eye view. Choose some toys, look out of a window for a view of the garden, car on the drive, or down the stairs. Draw what you can see - remember you won't see the whole or side of what you see. The different objects will probably be 2d shapes that may or may not look like the actual thing.

On the next page we have used Spikes view above and created our own aerial plan of the Anglo Saxon collection.
